Health Sciences North REGIONAL IMPACT




HSN serves as the primary regional healthcare hub in Northeastern Ontario, receiving patients from 23 hospitals across the region for specialized care and treatment.

- Transform surgical care in Northeastern Ontario by investing in state-of-the-art tools, including a robotics program and hybrid operating room.



Our Commitment:


We will foster a collaborative and engaging culture in an inclusive environment that is physically, psychologically and culturally safe.



A focus on sustainability will enable us to be here when people need us the most – now and into the future.


Our Commitment:
